

Pathway for a Parent/Guardian to Report a Suspected School Bullying Incident.

Step 1: Recognise and Gather Information

Observe: Note any signs or evidence of bullying (physical, verbal, exclusion, etc.).

Document: Write down specific incidents, dates, times, locations, who was involved and any witnesses.

Step 2: Contact the School

- Reach out to your son's Year Head first via a phone call to the school office (046-9023772) or the school app and request an in person meeting.
- If you are reporting a case of alleged bullying of another student, reach out to the relevant Year Head.

Step 3: School Meeting

- At the meeting state your concerns, share documented evidence
- The school will request you to submit a **Bí Cineálta Bullying Incident Report Form** to the school.

Step 4: School Investigation

- The school **Bí Cineálta Team** will initiate an investigation, this may include interviews with your son/student(s) being targeted, alleged perpetrators, witnesses, and a review of the evidence.
- You will be kept informed about the process and progress regularly, usually within 10 working days. (If the investigation involves your son).

Step 5: Outcome and Actions

- Once the investigation is complete, the school will share the outcome with you and your son/student(s).
- Appropriate actions will be taken based on Bi Cineálta guidelines, which may include:
 - Mediation
 - Disciplinary measures/School sanctions.
 - Support for the students involved (e.g. a meeting with the school counsellor/Chaplain)
 - o Close monitoring and follow-up after 20 days.

Step 6: Escalation- if Unsatisfied

• If you feel the issue remains unresolved or the bullying report was not addressed fully, you may:

Request a meeting with the **School Principal.**

Step 7: External Support- Seek additional support if needed for your son

Summary Flowchart (for quick reference):

- 1. Notice bullying → Document incidents
- 2. Contact Year Head-Deputy Principal
- 3. Request a meeting
- 4. Submit formal report to school
- 5. School investigation (within 10 working days)
- 6. Outcome of investigation and support arranged if required
- 7. Escalate to School Principal if necessary
- 8. Seek external support as needed
